ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR

Despite a fall in income from lettings, a healthy surplus of £1843 has been generated. This has been mainly achieved through containment of costs.

The largest single maintenance cost was the floor treatment, which is essential to keep the Hall attractive to the many dance groups that we have.

The net assets have risen to £25875.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
